LP21 CEMETERY

To consider purchasing one or more columbaria's for the cemetery. The Clerk updates that Cllrs S Shaw-Wright, J Shaw-Wright, M Davis, the Clerk and the Resource Manager met to identify suitable areas in the cemetery for one or more columbaria's, before meeting with a company who specialise in these memorials.

LP23 1811 BUILDING

LP23.1 Town Council

The Clerk updates that the Finance Manger and Market/Event Manager are both working permanently from the 1st floor of the 1811. The Administration Officer and the Clerk are both working some days from there also.

Broadband and a telephone line have been installed and the Clerk is working towards installing a 'switch' which will enable some of the handsets from the Town Hall to be used at the 1811 and connected to the Town Hall telephone number.

The Clerk updates that the Resource Manager met with Groundwork and confirmed the work to the pond will be started in December.

LP27 PLAYAREAS

To note that all the play areas are now open after a full safety check and being disinfected. The play areas have signage on reminding users to adhere to social distancing, sanitising hands etc. All play areas are currently disinfected weekly, this may not be required once the weather changes in the Autumn.

To note there has been some vandalism at the Barwic Parade play area, some youths were seen setting fire to the grass carpeting and several timber posts on the mound bridge have been ripped off.

LP28 TRAINING

The Clerk updates that Askham Bryan do not offer any short Gardening courses, however Bishop Burton do a course over 6 consecutive Saturdays offering Plant establishment and maintenance, Common weeds, pests and diseases and other suitable skills. The cost for the course is £180 and the course is run from April through to September.

Harlow Carr also offer a 'Beginners guide to gardening' which is a one day workshop costing £61.
